Test Information

FastBridge:

Performed with students in grades K-8. The purpose of this suite of assessments is to evaluate student progress in the areas of early reading, reading comprehension, reading fluency and math. Minnesota Statute 120B.123 requires that all districts must administer an approved evidence-based reading screener to students in kindergarten through grade 3 three times per year. It is a local decision to administer the screener to students in grades 4-12 based on a gated process to fulfill legislative requirements for upper grades. Furthermore, it is a local decision to administer the screener in math and SEL to carefully monitor student progress and respond to student needs in a timely manner.

Time spent by grade:

K-1 20 minutes 3 times a year 2 and 3 64 minutes 3 times a year 4-8, 9-11 60 minutes 3 times a year

Capti ReadBasix:

Performed with students in grades 4-12 as needed and required by Minnesota Statute 120B.123. The purpose of this suite of assessments is a diagnostic assessment used to determine students' reading skills in word recognition and decoding, vocabulary, morphology, sentence processing, reading efficiency, and reading comprehension. The results are used to inform instruction and intervention.

Time spent: approximately 60 minutes

Math MCA-III, Reading MCA-IV, Science MCA-IV:

Performed with students in grades 3-8, 10 and 11. The purpose of this series of assessments is to meet federal and state mandates evaluating student progress towards meeting the Minnesota Academic Standards. In addition the assessments are intended to provide graduates information related to career and college readiness. ESSA and Minnesota Statute 120B.302 require that all public school students be assessed in reading, math and science.

Time spent by grade per year:

3 and 4	2.5-3.5 hours for reading and 2 hours for math
5	2.5-3.5 hours for reading, 2 hours for math and 1.75 hours for science
6 and 7	2.5-3.5 hours for reading, and 2 hours for math
8	2.5-3.5 hours for reading, 2 hours for math and 1.75 hours for science
10	2.5-3 hours for reading and 2 hours for science
11	2-2.5 hours for math

Math MTAS, Reading AltMCA, Science AltMCA:

Performed with students in grades 3-8, 10 and 11 with Individual Education Plans (IEP's) indicating eligibility for the MTAS (Math) or AltMCA (Reading and Science) assessment in place of the MCA's. The purpose of this series of performance based assessments is to meet federal and state mandates evaluating student progress on state standards. ESSA and Minnesota Statute 120B.302 require that all public school students be assessed in reading, math and science.

Time spent by grade per year:

*Time varies significantly, based on the skills and developmental level of the student

ACCESS for ELLs 2.0:

English Language learners are students who are identified in MARSS as eligible for participation in English as a Second Language or Bilingual Education Programs. The purpose of this series of assessments is to meet federal and state mandates to measure progress towards meeting the WIDA English Language Development Standards. ESSA requires that all English learners be assessed in grades K-12 in English Language Proficiency to measure Annual Measurable Achievement Objectives.

Time spent by subject:

Up to 65 minutes up to 90 minutes up to 60 minutes up to 60 minutes Speaking up to 50 minutes

PreACT:

Performed with students in grade 10. The purpose of this suite of assessments is to evaluate student progress in the areas of reading, math, science and English. The source of the requirement is a local decision to carefully monitor student progress and to evaluate student college and career readiness.

Time spent: 4 hours

ACT:

Administered with students in grade 11 or 12. The purpose of this suite of assessments is to provide students with information related to career and college readiness. The ACT is composed of 4 multiple choice tests - reading, math, science and English. The Minnesota Department of Education requires schools to give students the opportunity to participate in a college entrance exam on a school day. Minnesota Statute 120B.30 is the source for this district requirement.

Time spent: 4 hours

ASVAB Career Exploration Program:

Administered with students in grade 11 or 12. The ASVAB is an aptitude test that identifies skill strengths. The purpose of this suite of assessments is to provide students with a career exploration service that allows students to explore paths to careers. The ASVAB is composed of multiple choice tests - verbal, math, and science/technology.

Time spent: 1.5 hours

PSAT:

EVW provides students in grade 11 the opportunity to participate in the PSAT exam. One purpose of the exam is to qualify for the National Merit Scholarship program.

Time spent: 3 hours

Test Results

FstBridge and Capti ReadBasix test results will be provided to parents/guardians at conferences or mailed home.

MCA / MTAS and AltMCA / ACCESS test results are mailed home to parents/guardians in September, depending on when school resumes and when forms are received from MDE.

PreACT test results will be handed out to students within a month after the school receives those results.

ACT and PSAT - Results are sent directly to the students / parents.

ASVAB - Results will be handed out to students within a month after the school receives those results.
